Through **smart restoration and adaptive reuse**, old buildings and sites can be given new leases of life to bring economic and social dynamism to cities and regions.

The initiative has three main components:

EXCHANGE OF GOOD PRACTICE

The initiative will showcase examples of where industrial, religious and military heritage has been successfully reused. Creative Europe-funded networks will organise conferences to share experiences and discuss challenges.

During the European Cultural Heritage Summit, to be held in June in Berlin, the European Commission will organise a workshop on adaptive reuse and highlight best practices from EU Prizes for Cultural Heritage (Europa Nostra) and Contemporary Architecture (Mies van der Rohe Foundation).

URBAN/RURAL REGENERATION AND SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT
